



# Message from the Board Chair and President & CEO







President & CEO

#### At the heart of the action-with you!

We are delighted with this period of exciting growth, full of opportunities, a time in which we can take pride! We are aware of the role we play in our economy and our community. We have been working hard towards the strategic goals set forth during the new momentum announced last year.

We marshaled all the resources we needed. Now, we are enjoying outstanding results that will have a significant impact on the future.

#### A new peak

It took more than 40 years to surpass 1979's record volume of 35 million tonnes. This year's pinnacle of 37 million tonnes of cargo is of national significance—it makes the Port of Sept-Îles one of the country's leading ports. We proudly reclaimed second place among Canadian ports in terms of annual volume of activity, ahead of the Port of Montreal and behind Vancouver. We have also reaffirmed our status as the largest mineral port in North America.

And what about the 50 million tonnes handled at the Multi-user Dock since it was commissioned in 2018! Thanks to this strategic asset serving the iron industry, the Port of Sept-Îles has experienced sustained growth, supported by onsite teams who have maintained an enviable reliability rate of more than 97% since start-up. We want to recognize the success of our clients, Quebec Iron Ore, Tacora Resources, as well as LOGISTEC and the Société Ferroviaire et Portuaire de Pointe-Noire, who help keep the supply chain turning and iron ore exports growing.

#### **Dialogue**

To guide future development and with the intention of opening a dialogue with the community the Port of Sept-Îles also launched an online public consultation in October 2023 entitled "Ré-imaginez le cœur de Sept-Îles" (Reimagine the Heart of Sept-Îles). This innovative approach to collecting development ideas for the harmonization of riverfront spaces in the downtown area was a great success: 6,819 participants, 55 projects submitted, and 748 votes on the specially designed platform.

We would like to thank all citizens for their participation in such large numbers and tell them how vital their suggestions are in shaping the Port's future development. 2024 marks the 25th anniversary of the Port Authority's autonomy! We can get the next quarter-century off to a strong start thanks to a transparent and sustainable connection with our communities, a start that will incorporate ideas gathered during consultation.

#### **Stronger together**

In 2023 and with the support of the Government of Quebec, economic players in the region, namely the Port of Sept-Îles and the economic development corporations of Sept-Îles and Port-Cartier, were able to proceed with the consolidation of Port-Cartier-Sept-Îles industrial port zones. The creation of this new large territory will help make certain sectors with strong industrial potential more attractive to developers worldwide, especially in the global context of energy transition and opportunities related to decarbonization.

Given that the maritime activity of the industrial port zone of Port-Cartier-Sept-Îles represents 50% of total operations on the St. Lawrence River as well as 15% of the commercial value of Quebec's annual exports, it goes without saying that we have a world-class industrial ecosystem that we must promote on a large scale.

#### At the heart of economic activity

We have all the right assets to process our iron products locally and to shift towards the production of green steel here in the region. The Port intends to support international developers who are eager to make the region a home for their green projects while vigilantly protecting the environment and precious ecosystem of the Bay of Sept-Îles.

The current interest of major steel companies in high-purity iron from the Labrador Trough to accelerate the industry's decarbonization efforts is also a unique opportunity. Now, more than ever, it's the perfect time for all socio-economic players in the region to support everything that needs to be done to make the most of these unmissable opportunities!

#### An organization with heart!

We renewed our commitment throughout the year to many community organizations, projects, and the hosting of several events. We eagerly invest to support families and individuals with special needs to help with the necessary development of a dynamic and respectful living environment. In all, more than \$340,000 in contributions and support has been allocated to various causes and made a difference for many. We must recognize the contribution of many members of our team who actively promote our commitment to the community; helping to improve quality of life and well-being for our communities and those around us.

### Announcements

#### **DECEMBER 13**

The Sept-Îles Port Authority is pleased to announce today that the Government of Quebec will contribute \$10 million towards the modernization of the Monseigneur-Blanche Terminal at the Port of Sept-Îles.

The upcoming completion of this \$30-million modernization project will, among other things, make supply chains that go through the largest mineral port in North America more reliable. It will also sustain the activities of the only cruise ship stopover on the St. Lawrence, whose appeal centers on discovery of Innu culture.









## **Public Consultation**

To guide future development and with the intention of opening a dialogue with the community, in October 2023 the Port of Sept-Îles also launched an online public consultation entitled "Ré-imaginez le cœur de Sept-Îles" (Reimagine the Heart of Sept-Îles). The platform consisted of two modules: a question-and-answer module people could use to ask the Port team questions, and an idea box module to share project ideas for development or improvement in the Port region. The platform let people vote on ideas that were submitted.

# An Organization with Heart!

#### Financial contributions and a maritime theme


The City received \$260,000 from the Port of Sept-Îles to revamp Aylmer-Whittom Park. This partnership inspired the maritime theme for this family-friendly playground—a ten (10) metre-long ship takes pride of place so young explorers and budding pirates alike can sail away to adventure!

"It's on the edge of the bay and young and old alike love it, which makes Aylmer-Whittom park a real treasure of our region's natural heritage. When the idea of a maritime theme for this new family playground was suggested to us, we immediately wanted to contribute to the project," said Pierre D. Gagnon, President & CEO of the Port of Sept-Îles.

# At the Heart of Major Events















## Environment

In 2023, the Port made further progress in the Green Marine certification program, which guides the maritime industry towards environmental excellence and leadership. The Port has, in particular, improved upon indicators of underwater noise and community relations.


The Port has completed its inventory of emissions from port activities and achieved a Level 3 ranking as part of the "Cohorte Carbone Côte-Nord," initiated by Environnement Côte-Nord and the Écoleader Fund. These emissions, which are caused by Port activities, were offset by the Carbone Boréal program. Also, more than 50% of the administration's fleet of service vehicles have been converted to green technologies.

The Port stood out for improvements in the underwater noise indicator. We developed a subsea noise management plan that aims to limit aquatic noise to acceptable levels for marine wildlife and raise awareness about this issue among all users in the Bay of Sept-Îles, especially commercial navigation.

Also, the Port continued to roll out the 5-year, \$5-million "Enviro-Actions" project in partnership with MTQ. The project, led by INREST, includes permanent acoustic monitoring in the waters of the Bay of Sept-Îles, in addition to near-real-time monitoring of water and air quality. In fact, the first water quality monitoring equipment was tested at the Cruise Ship Dock, which enabled us to start collecting data and set Enviro-Alertes thresholds.









Through this important project, the Port can showcase its environmental leadership, providing considerable financial support for scientific research into environmental impacts in industrial port areas, and also in its support of the Université Laval Research Chair in Coastal Ecosystems and Port, Industrial and Maritime Activities.

In 2023, the Port made community relations a priority by launching the "Reimagine the heart of Sept-Îles" public consultation ("Ré-imaginez le cœur de Sept-Îles"). This innovative approach sought to identify what the population wants when it comes to developing its urban territory and to participate in the revitalization of the downtown area, especially in solidifying riverbank access for all citizens and greening various areas to enhance their ecological value.

Finally, the Port continues to support local environmental organizations. This year, the Port contributed to the restoration of crossing sites located on the trails of the Nord-Côtiers de Sept-Îles quad ATV club. This project is led by the Organisme de bassins versants Duplessis whose mission is to promote learning about, as well as protection and enhancement of, the region's catchment areas, including the effluents that flow into the bay and are home to fish that live part of their lives in salt water.

## Port Operations

#### A HISTORIC PEAK

Due to a 9.5% increase in handled volume, the Port of Sept-Îles achieved its best year ever with 36.6 million tonnes, eclipsing its record of 34.9 million tonnes in 1979.

This new milestone makes Sept-Îles one of the country's leading ports. This historic peak places it second among Canadian ports (after Vancouver) in terms of annual tonnage and first on the St. Lawrence River, ahead of the Port of Montreal.

A 10% increase in iron ore exports led to a record 33.8 million tonnes. More than half (51%) was shipped to Asia, while a quarter was shipped to Europe.

A total of 542 ships docked in the Bay of Sept-Îles, 29 more than the previous year. Cruise ship volume in 2023 was similar to last year with 10 ships (one less than last year). Unfortunately, bad weather prevented both the mooring of the Queen Mary 2 and celebrations for the 10th anniversary of the date when the prestigious liner met Mylène Paquette in the middle of the Atlantic Ocean in September 2013. Mme Paquette and the Port are keen to get back on track in 2024.

## **Financial Results**

Due mainly to shipping volume growth at the multi-user terminal, gross revenue increased by 15.4% to \$32.1 million.

Operating expenses rose 7% to \$19.1 million, mainly due to higher volume-related costs and service purchases.

As a result, our operating income closed the year at \$13.0 million, which is \$3.0 million higher than last year.

Other items were significantly impacted by contractual obligations from the Multi-user Dock and changes in the fair market value of interest rate swaps.

Overall, comprehensive income fell by \$4.3 million to \$13.5 million (compared to \$17.8 million last year) mainly due to the large change in fair market value of interest rate swaps.
